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What does discrimination look like?

Definition of discrimination: the <u>unjust</u> or <u>prejudicial</u> treatment of different categories of people, especially on the grounds of ethnicity, age, sex, or disability.

IFHC Client Stories:

Client and roommate, both students at ISU in Pocatello were denied their assistance animal by their property manager. The manager erected multiple barriers, while also creating artificial deadlines for submitting layers of unnecessary paperwork. IFHC intervened, writing an education letter on behalf of the students outlining the documentation requirements and official HUD guidance on assistance animals and correcting much of the misinformation. As a result of IFHC's assistance, the tenants' reasonable accommodation was granted, the property manager removed any "pet penalties" from their charges and made changes to their assistance animal policy.

A LEP Client who was not born in this country, reached out to IFHC because his landlord was not responding to his multiple repair requests. For 8 years this property owner, who owns at least 7 other units in Ada county, was telling our client that such repairs were our client's responsibility and NOT HIS! IFHC educated the property owner and explained that they were in violation of Idaho State Landlord/Tenant law and possibly FHA law. IFHC asked that they revise all their leases and submitted a 3-day repair request. Since our intervention all repairs/habitability issues have been completed.
